  - b. Kay K: This is actually State funding, those funds are from the federal level
  - c. Eva W: You mentioned formula funds, is that going to be similar to 5311?

- f. David Averill: I would support having CASTA on CTE
- g. Anne: I was talking more about TRAC as a whole.
- h. Kay: The Board is created by legislation and appointed by the governor. They will likely be considering this as they appoint replacements soon
- i. Anne: About the new staff, will those positions go toward contracting and other bottlenecks in the process.
- j. Kay: Yes absolutely.

- i. David Averill: This timing issue has been a problem for a while. Before we would just get a commission loan, and then wait for FTA money to come in later. Why are we not going that route?
- ii. Kay: We have been talking with our CFO, and this came out to be the best solution. That is another tool in the toolbox, but we just didn't decide to use it in this case.
- iii. David: Also, since most of us at the local level use the calendar year for budgeting, adding another budget year could be very difficult.
- iv. David Johnson: I agree with David. Making others adjust to CDOT's fiscal year, and then still being late on contracts may be frustrating from local partners
- v. Emily Crespin: We are trying to mitigate that with this solution. We will circle back to see if a TC loan is possible, or possibly extend pre-award authority for admin and operating, but I hear you all about the calendar year preference.
- vi. Kay: I want to make sure, does anyone have other thoughts?
- vii. Jonathan Flint: I also agree, calendar year is preferred
- viii. Anne: My concern is that you may not be able to get reimbursements during pre-award authority. Smaller agencies may not be able to handle that. So that may not be the best solution, but we can research impacts.
  - ix. David Johnson: That makes sense, we can look into both options. The loan idea may solve all of these issues.
- b. Passenger Rail Update (David Singer, Assistant Director, Passenger Rail)
  - i. No questions
- c. Electrification Topics Update (Mike King, Assistant Director, Electrification and Energy)
  - i. David Johnson: I thought you said you had more funding than applications, but the graph seems to show the opposite (referring to slide 28)
  - ii. Mike King: That is true for the VW settlement funds, but the CTE awards will end up using all of its funding on awards.
