Q4	<p><b>Question: Field Laboratory</b></p> <p>From the SOW requirements: Field Laboratory: CDOT will provide a field laboratory and the required traffic control for the Project. The CDOT Construction Manager will advise the Head Testers on the availability of the field laboratory. The following equipment and supplies shall be furnished by the Consultant in sufficient quantity to ensure performance of all work required in a timely manner. Such equipment and supplies shall remain the property of the Consultant. All equipment shall have current calibration and be maintained in satisfactory condition. 1. A.C. content gauge and/or extraction equipment and solvents</p> <p>CDOT QA firms do not have an AC content gage or extraction equipment. The solvents are highly toxic and present environmental issues with use and disposal. Field labs have always had a burn off oven because they wanted the mix gradations. Those are typically supplied in the trailer by the contractor. An AC content gauge is usually used by the HMA supplier. They use them because they are quick, but not as accurate as burn off oven. Can you revise the SOW to align with common practices and remove the requirement to provide an A.C. content gauge and extraction equipment.</p> <p><b>Answer:</b> No A.C. content gage or AC extraction equipment needs are anticipated from the Owner's Representative.</p>	01/30/2024
