SIGNIFICANT CHANGES TO FHWA-CDOT 2012-13 STEWARDSHIP AGREEMENT

- 1. MAP-21 was introduced (and thus replaced SAFETEA LU) as the new guidance to define the role and responsibilities of CDOT and FHWA for administering Federal-Aid Highway Program (FAHP).
- 2. CDOT and FHWA have revised their guidelines and procedures for risk analysis and mitigation, and will jointly develop an annual prioritized list of risk statement and a response strategy for each identified risk.
- 3. Performance Measurement Program section was revised to reflect current practices.
- 4. Commission and CDOT Priorities were updated to reflect changes from investment categories to budget categories.
- 5. Performance Measures Compliance Indicators were updated for all programs to be in alignment with CDOT performance measures and reflect current performance.
- 6. Functional Program Areas Updates:
 - a. Safety and Traffic Engineering: The Performance/Compliance indicators used to assess performance of the CDOT Safety and Traffic Engineering programs have been updated.
 - b. Design and construction: The CDOT design program manager and CDOT Area Engineers are respectively responsible for assisting the CDOT Regions to maintain uniform practices in the design and construction. The Performance/Compliance indicators used to assess the health of the Design and Construction program have been updated.
 - c. Structure: The Performance/Compliance indicators used to assess the health of the structures program have been updated.
 - d. Intelligent Transportation System (ITS): The Performance/Compliance indicators used to assess the health of the ITS program and the FHWA Required Action List have been updated.
 - e. Planning: The Branch was restructured from the Multimodal Planning Branch (MPB) to the planning and performance Branch (PPB). Safe Routes to School (SRTS), and Scenic Byways programs were eliminated in Map-21. The Performance/Compliance indicators used to assess the health of the CDOT Planning program have been updated.
 - f. Research: The Performance/Compliance indicators used to assess the health of the Research program have been updated.
 - g. Civil Rights: The program was reorganized as CDOT Civil Rights & Business Resource Center (CRBRC) which was previously known as the Center for Equal Opportunity (EO). The Performance/Compliance indicators used to assess the health of the Civil rights program have been updated.
 - h. Asset Management: Asset Management is a new program that has been added in the FHWA-CDOT Stewardship Agreement
