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Water that flows off of Colorado highways is received by drainage features and eventually discharged into a stream, river or lake. Therefore, under the Clean Water Act, CDOT is required to use Best Management Practices (BMPs) to prevent and reduce the pollutants in stormwater discharges from highway construction sites.

BMPs are schedules of activities, prohibitions of practices, maintenance procedures, and other management practices to reduce water pollution. BMPs also include treatment, operating procedures, pollution prevention and practices to control site runoff, spillage or leaks, waste disposal, or drainage from the storage of materials. BMPs include structural and non-structural controls. They can be temporary (during construction) or permanent (remaining after the construction is completed).



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
