Central I-25 Express Lanes

Why Express Lanes? The Answer is Simple: Choice.

Express Lanes are always built adjacent to existing general purpose lanes and offer roadway users the choice to pay a toll, use transit or carpool for a more reliable trip. On CDOT's Express Lane corridors, travelers in all lanes (including the general purpose lanes) see time savings of anywhere from 20% to 50%. By offering choices, Express Lanes help to reduce delays, manage congestion and keep travel times reliable for motorists.


Central I-25 from Downtown Denver to US 36

The I-25 Central Express Lanes are two reversible lanes between US 36 and downtown Denver, which are barrier-separated from the general purpose lanes. Depending upon the time of day, the I-25 Central Express Lanes in downtown Denver can connect to both the I-25 Express Lanes from US 36 to 120th Avenue and the US 36 Express Lanes.

Corridor Basics

- 7 miles of Express Lanes from US 36 and 20th Street in downtown Denver.
- Lanes are reversible and open at specific times:
 - Weekdays:
 - Southbound lanes are open from 5 11 a.m.
 - Northbound lanes are open from noon 3 a.m.
 - Weekends:
 - Northbound lanes are open from noon 3 a.m.
- Overhead signage indicates current toll prices. Tolls are collected through ExpressToll account or License Plate Toll.
- Free HOV3+, free motorcycle, bus and toll options are available.
- HOV3+ users must have a Switchable HOV Transponder and three or more people in the vehicle to use the Express Lanes for free.
