

#### **Local Government Role**

CDOT is looking for shared responsibility as it relates to new and, in some cases, existing stations.

#### Some likely areas of partnership include:

- ✓ Functional local coalition(s) of support
- ✓ Public benefit (i.e., mode shift, community access, etc.)
- ✓ Local station funding assistance (in some circumstances)

# Funding Mechanisms and Opportunities Moving Forward







#### **State Funding Sources:**

- SB 24-184 Congestion Impact Fees on rental cars, can only be used on rail projects, begins 2025
- SB 24-230, Oil and Gas Production Fees
- SB 24-190, Rail and Coal Transition Community Economic Measures
- Note funding for existing road projects <u>cannot</u> be diverted to pay for rail projects

#### **Federal Grant Dollars:**

 Funding may be available through Federal Railroad Administration grant programs such as Corridor ID, Fed-State Partnership, CRISI, and R&E

#### Other Potential Funds:

- Local governments/ entities may seek funding mechanisms
- Fares from ticket sales


