

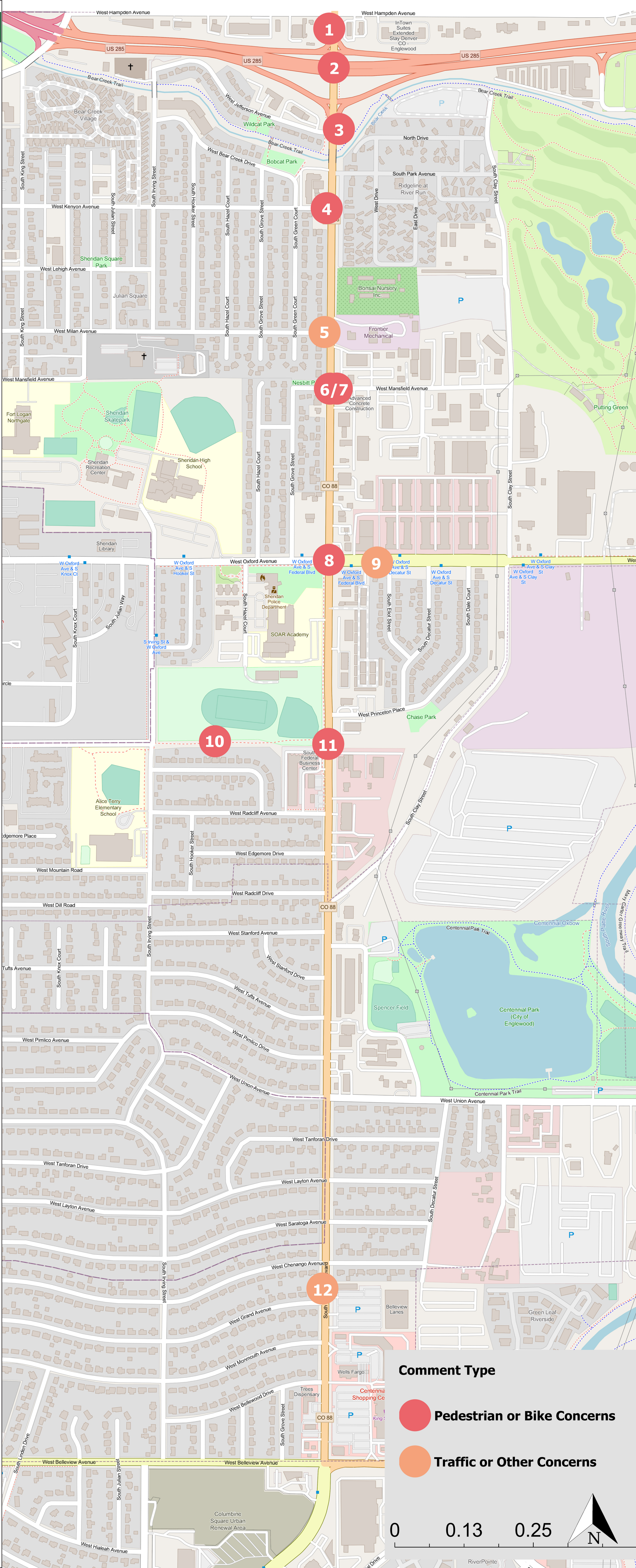
What we have heard so far:

- 1 Sidewalk Gap: West side Federal from 285 ramp to W. Hampden Ave.
- 2 Low visibility under bridge - 285/Federal under bridge.
- 3 Potential Future Trailhead - West of Federal at intersection with W. Jefferson Ave.
- 4 Need a signal - Intersection with W. Kenyon Ave & S Federal Blvd.
- 5 Need traffic signal - Intersection with W. Milan Ave & S. Federal Blvd.
- 6 Pedestrian crossing should be evaluated at intersection.
- 7 Pedestrian Crossing - Mansfield Ave & Federal Blvd.
- 8 Evaluate pedestrian crossing timing at Oxford Ave. crossing.
- 9 Congestion Westbound on W. Oxford Ave.
- 10 Trees, pedestrian refuge, detached sidewalks - Along Quincy Ave.
- 11 Potential pedestrian crossing at W Quincy Trail & Federal Blvd.
- 12 Slower speeds downhill - Along south end of S. Federal Blvd.

Corridor-wide / Non-location specific

- 13 Lots of potential added traffic.
- 14 Lighting inconsistent, very dark outside of intersections.
- 15 Pedestrians have difficult time crossing Federal due to spacing of crossings.
- 16 Bike lanes needed, especially physically separated bike lanes.
- 17 Install dedicated crossings for bicyclists and pedestrians to cross Federal Blvd.
- 18 Install dedicated crossings for bicyclists and pedestrians to cross Federal Blvd.
- 19 Enhance the corridor's appearance with landscaping.
- 20 Reduce vehicle traffic delays.
- 21 Upgrade bus stops.
- 22 Reduce bus transit delays.
