## **Speaker Frequently Asked Questions**



#### What is the Colorado Traffic Safety Summit?

The <u>Colorado Department of Transportation's</u> <u>Highway Safety Office</u> and <u>Traffic Safety and</u> <u>Engineering Services</u> created the Colorado Traffic Safety Summit as an opportunity to bring together law enforcement, engineering, community planning, education, advocacy, emergency response, and healthcare professionals to share information and best practices to address critical issues on Colorado's roadways.

### Where and when is the 2023 Colorado Traffic Safety Summit?

The summit is a two-day conference beginning Monday, July 22 through Tuesday, July 23. The summit will be held at <u>The Antlers Hotel</u> in Colorado Spring, Colorado.

### Who attends the Colorado Traffic Safety Summit?

Professionals of all career stages and backgrounds attend the summit. This includes first responders, engineers, community planning professionals, advocacy groups, health care professionals, and other safety champions.

## What are the eligibility requirements for presentation submission?

All submissions must be in English and include the following:

- Presenter contact information (i.e., name, title, phone number, email information)
- Presentation title
- Overview of the session (350 characters)
- Additional speakers
- Session area (i.e., safe roads)
- Session duration
- Session proposals must be submitted to <u>this</u> <u>form</u> by Thursday, February 29

#### Is there an honorarium for speaking?

We are unable to provide honoraria or reimburse for travel and/or lodging expenses.

# Do speakers need to register for the Colorado Traffic Safety Summit?

All speakers **MUST REGISTER** for the 2024 Colorado Traffic Safety Summit. Speakers will be sent a registration link via email when registration becomes available.

# Will I be notified if my idea/submission is selected?

All submissions will be reviewed by the summit planning committee and safety groups made up of subject matter experts in March/April. All speakers will be contacted via email in late April about the selection status.



All selected speakers will be contacted via email with summit details and deadlines. Each session will have a speaker orientation meeting to discuss presentations and next steps.



# Does submitting an idea or proposal guarantee my acceptance?

Idea or session submission does not guarantee selection.

# Will the planning committee contact the additional speakers listed on the form?

Yes, once selected the confirmation email will be sent to all speakers with contact information.
